Dear Sir or Madam,

This letter serves as my formal written notice to opt out of any agreement to arbitrate disputes as may be contained in any contract, membership agreement, terms of service, or other contractual arrangement (the “Agreement”) between myself and the recipient or any affiliated entities. This opt out letter does not waive any other rights or remedies that I may have under applicable law, including but not limited to rights to pursue claims in small claims court where permissible.
