This Letter shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of _____, without regard to conflict of laws principles. Venue for any disputes arising hereunder shall lie exclusively in the courts of _____ County, _____.

Clause 6 – Execution and Counterparts

This Letter may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Clause 7 – Effective Date

This decision becomes effective upon issuance by the authorized Parole Board official.

Clause 8 – Entire Agreement

This Letter constitutes the entire agreement between the parties concerning the parole decision and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and understandings.

Clause 9 – Notice

All notices required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing and sent to the addresses on file or as otherwise designated in writing.

Clause 10 – Remedies

The parties agree that any breach of the terms herein may give rise to legal and equitable remedies, including injunctive relief.
